5. **BUSINESS**

5.1 Rent increase

This is being challenged by the Committee on the basis of the terms of the Tenancy agreement.

At this point the rent that will be collected is the amount the Council has specified (plus water rates). It is hoped that if the challenge is successful, any overpayment will be re-imbursed.

5.2 Verges

This was formally done by the Council but the Tenant's agreement places the responsibility for verge management on the plot-holder. A one-off verge spray will be arranged by the Committee, after which all plot-holders should manage any and all verges adjacent to their garden.

5.3 Traffic

There have been various complaints this year about traffic.

Please apply common sense, apply the highway code and simply courtesies.

Use passing spaces; give way to traffic passing up-hill; do not block roads with parking (or at least be willing and immediately able to move your vehicle when asked) etc.

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5.4 Gates

These must be shut upon entrance and exit. (But they do not need to be locked except at advertised times and by the Committee)

The Tenant's agreement requires that gates are shut, but it is also important given the recent fly tipping incidents and a local person who is harassing plotholders about burning.

Given the amount that the society has spent on perimeter fencing to keep us all safe, it is also pointless to 'build a fortress and leave the draw-bridge open'.

Despite the inconvenience, please protect everybody and the site by closing the gates.

5.5 Fires

Local complaints have reduced but we should all take care to follow basic guidelines about bonfires.

They should be used only when necessary; burn only dry material (and certainly no plastics, paints etc.); they should observe the wind direction (away from the houses nearby). Don't burn in wet, damp or foggy weather as the smoke lingers in the air and doesn't disperse. Please use common sense. The best advice is available from the environmental agency at their website.

5.6 Trees

Overhanging trees have been raised with the Council and we are advised that this is in the queue. The Committee is checking about the status of trees along the Cut Throat Dene.
